IMPORTANT CHANGES TO YOUR RECYCLING

Simpler Recycling is here.

You can now recycle a wider range of items at home such as rinsed out food and drink cartons (Tetra Paks) and empty aerosols. These can now be added to your dry mixed recycling bin. Other new items you can also recycle include: squeezable metal tubes such as the type used for tomato puree; squeezable plastic tubes such as toothpaste and cosmetics tubes and non-black plastic plant pots.

Please use the Surrey Recycles search tool to find out what to do with any items you are unsure of, visit jointwastesolutions.org.

Being able to recycle more items is positive news – for the planet and your pocket. Recycling is the most environmentally friendly and cost-effective method the council can use to process waste – and any savings can be put towards other essential services that benefit the community.

Hidden batteries pose a fire risk for bin trucks and recycling stations. Protect our crews and recycle your batteries separately. Get the right bin every time by using the Surrey Recycles search tool.
